

Children in Scotland – evidencing the voices of children and young people

We believe children and young people should be fully involved in developing solutions to the issues affecting them and felt we could make better use of the evidence from them that was already available. Our ideas for a Children and Young People's Evidence Bank were first discussed at the CYPFEIF & ALEC Fund conference in 2018, and we realised that others in the sector agreed. As a result, we started seeking funding for a publicly available evidence bank and were grateful to be able to use funding from our National Third Sector GIRFEC project to make this idea a reality.

In April 2019, the Children and Young People's Evidence Bank was launched! It provides a collection of direct quotes from children and young people on a wide range of themes, and there has never been a more extensive and informative collection of children's voices in one place. Joint working by NSPCC's Childline, Carers Trust Scotland and National Deaf Children's Society to improve support through Childline

Childline is working with National Deaf Children's Society to help highlight Childline's chat service for deaf children and young people along with opportunities for young deaf adults to become Childline volunteers. Because of this work there are a growing number of deaf volunteers and interpreters in volunteer roles at Childline.

Childline has also been working with Carers Trust. Childline staff will be supporting the Carers festival, attending Carers Trust staff meetings and talking to young carers in order to highlight Childline as a resource. Carers Trust are going to provide training for Childline staff and volunteers, raising awareness of the issues that can affect young carers. In turn this will enable Childline staff to signpost young carers to appropriate support in relation to their caring responsibilities.
